
Let's explore a few details about our esteemed special guests

A chemical engineer from UDCT, Mumbai, he was also the President of Indian National Science Academy and the President of Institution of Chemical Engineers, UK. The President of India honoured Dr Mashelkar with three of the highest civilian awards, namely Padmashri (1991), Padmabhushan (2000) and Padma Vibhushan (2014). Among the other dignitaries, present were Dr Bhushan Patwardhan an distinguished Professor of Health Sciences, biomedical scientist, and ethnopharmacologist. Dr Girish Bapat, head and director of Jnana Prabodhini and Punyabhushan Nitin Desai who heads the Pune Gujarati Trust.




Siya Patel (7 th A)



"Savor the Sweetness: Authentic Bengali Rice Payesh Recipe"



Our students loved the Rice payesh the most. It's a delightful Bengali dessert that's easy to make at home. Here's a simple recipe for you to try:

Ingredients

1/2 cup rice (or any short-grain rice)

4 cups whole milk

1/2 cup sugar (adjust to taste)

1/4 teaspoon cardamom powder

A pinch of saffron strands (optional)

A handful of chopped nuts

(almonds, cashews, and pistachios)

1 tablespoon ghee (clarified butter)

A few raisins (optional)



Wash and Soak the Rice

Rinse the rice under cold water until the water runs clear.

Soak the rice in enough water for about 30 minutes. This helps the rice cook faster and evenly.

Boil the Milk

In a heavy-bottomed pan, bring the 4 cups of milk to a boil over medium heat.

Stir the milk occasionally to prevent it from sticking to the bottom of the pan and forming a layer of cream on top.

Add Rice and Cook

Drain the soaked rice and add it to the boiling milk.

Reduce the heat to low and let the rice simmer in the milk. Stir occasionally to prevent the rice from sticking to the bottom.

Add Sugar and Nuts:

After the rice has cooked for about 25-30 minutes and has become soft and creamy, add the sugar and stir well.

Continue to cook on low heat until the sugar dissolves completely.

Flavor with Cardamom and Saffron

Add the cardamom powder and saffron strands (if using) for flavor and aroma. Mix well.

Fry the Nuts

In a separate small pan, heat the ghee over low heat.

Add the chopped nuts and raisins (if using) and fry until the nuts turn golden brown. This step adds a delightful crunch to the Payesh.

Combine Nuts and Payesh

Pour the fried nuts and ghee mixture into the rice and milk mixture. Stir gently to combine.

Cool and Serve

Allow the Rice Payesh to cool to room temperature. It will thicken as it cools.

You can serve it either warm or chilled, garnished with some extra nuts and saffron strands.
