






## Celebrating academic excellence: Students shine in NSO










### World Book Day - Fostering a Love for Reading








## A culinary journey into Thailand








## Here's a recipe for a delicious Veg Thai Curry





#### Ingredients

1 tablespoon vegetable oil

1 small onion, finely chopped

2 cloves garlic, minced

1 red bell pepper, thinly sliced

1 yellow bell pepper, thinly sliced

1 cup broccoli florets

1 carrot, thinly sliced

1 zucchini, sliced

1 can (14 oz) coconut milk

2 tablespoons Thai green curry paste

1 tablespoon soy sauce

1 tablespoon brown sugar

1 tablespoon lime juice

Salt to taste

Fresh cilantro leaves for garnish

Cooked rice or noodles for serving



#### Instructions:

Heat the vegetable oil in a large skillet or wok over medium heat. Add the chopped onion and minced garlic to the skillet and sauté until fragrant, about 2 minutes. Add the sliced bell peppers, broccoli florets, carrots, and zucchini to the skillet. Cook for 5-7 minutes, or until the vegetables are slightly tender. In a separate bowl, whisk together the coconut milk, Thai red curry paste, soy sauce, brown sugar, lime juice, and salt until well combined. Pour the coconut milk mixture over the vegetables in the skillet. Stir to combine. Bring the curry to a simmer and cook for an additional 5-7 minutes, or until the vegetables are cooked to your liking and the sauce has thickened slightly. Taste and adjust the seasoning as needed, adding more salt or lime juice if desired. Remove the skillet from heat and garnish the curry with fresh cilantro leaves. Serve the Veg Thai curry hot with cooked rice or noodles.
